Aktuelle Themen der Niederlandistik

Error correction or corrective feedback (CF) is a didactic tool commonly used in language classrooms to help learners develop their (written) language skills. Its usefulness, however, has been hotly debated and extensively researched ever since Truscott's 1996 article in which he claimed CF to be ineffective and potentially harmful. The overall conclusion from the existing research base is that CF actually has the potential to facilitate language learning (e.g., Bitchener, 2012). The follow-up question now is when and how CF works. This presentation discusses a series of CF studies that explore how factors such as target structure, CF type, individual differences (e.g., motivation, aptitude), and correction strategies influence CF use and effectiveness.
