

Max Geilinger Junior Fellowship in German-Swiss Literature 2020/21

Postponed to 2021/22

Max Geilinger Foundation (Zürich) and German Section in the Department of Modern Languages and Culture (Queen Mary University of London)

Applications are invited for a one-semester Junior Research Fellowship in German-Swiss Literature, funded by Max Geilinger Foundation (Zürich). The postholder will be teaching in the department of German in the School of Languages, Linguistics and Film at QMUL in the autumn semester 2020/21 (14 September to 11 December 2020) supported by the Max Geilinger Foundation (Zürich).

Salary will be CHF 14,000 (paid by Max Geilinger Foundation (Zürich) and accommodation on the Mile End Campus (London, UK).

The successful applicant will have a completed PhD or equivalent and pursue a research project on aspects of the reception of German-Swiss literature in the UK since the late 19th century and teach one 11 week module on German-Swiss Literature (2 hrs/wk). Applicants will be required to submit a detailed research plan as part of their application (750 words) and a brief module outline (300 words).

Candidates must be able to demonstrate their eligibility to work in the UK in accordance with the Immigration, Asylum and Nationality Act 2006. Where required this may include entry clearance or continued leave to remain under the Points Based Immigration Scheme.
